SEMINAR

This new project aims to introduce the theme of **international dispute resolution** to students enrolled in Law, Global Law, and European Legal Studies degree programs.

The seminar will be divided into **4 sessions** (3 hours each):

- 1 Introduction to the topics, explaining the history of methods for resolving international disputes
- 2 National and international institutions operating in this field, briefly delving into their history and peculiarities.
- 3 Subjects that are debated in front of international courts (e.g., investment cases, commercial disputes, and cases before the WTO).

The discussion will focus on practical aspects related to international arbitration, past challenges, and future prospects, referencing the professional experiences of the speakers.

At the end of the seminar, ELSA Torino members will be awarded **2 ECTS** credits under the category 'Other Activities,' and certificates of participation will be issued to all students.
